## Cattell test, child version for boys (8-12 years)

## **Interpretation of results**

When calculating raw points, a <a href="~/Content/Cattell(boys)\_eng.pdf" style="font-size:16px">standard key template</a> is used, which is superimposed on the questionnaire.

Each key match is worth 1 point. The form of interpretation for the options for boys and girls is absolutely identical. The resulting score is a preliminary "raw" assessment.
